

Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere.¹ Most Haitian parents cannot afford to feed, clothe, or send their children to school, let alone seek medical care for injuries or illnesses. The lack of access to clean water, sanitation, adequate food, and basic healthcare claims most lives in Haiti.²

Life In Haiti

80% of Haitians don't have access to improved sanitation facilities³

60% of Haitians lack access to basic healthcare services⁴

58% of Haitians exist below the poverty line (earning <\$2.42/day)⁵

45% of Haitians in rural areas do not have clean drinking water³

42% of Haitian women give birth without a skilled birth attendant⁵

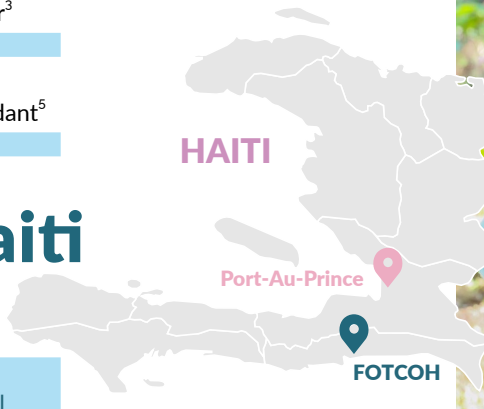

DENTAL CARE

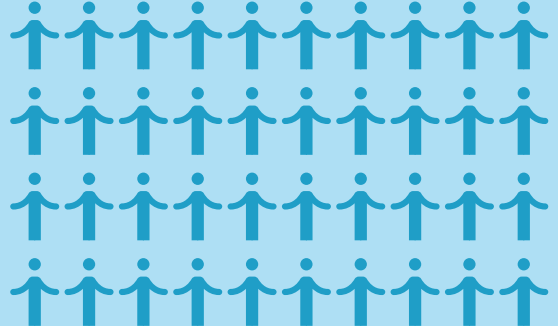
Education, extractions, and fluoride treatments for children
