


PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

2020 was a year full of accomplishments and milestones. During this pandemic year, we:

- Launched our Women's Health Initiative
- Relied on our knowledgeable Haitian team to lead clinics and Urgent Care
- Helped Haitian people heal from illnesses. The top 4 diagnoses this year were scabies, STIs, fungal infections, and Gastritis.

PHARMACY SPOTLIGHT

FOTCOH's on-site pharmacy provides critical medications for our patients. The pharmacy team includes Dr. Nelson, Pharmacist Roger, Lead Technician Nadine, and US Pharmacist Erin Briggs. Together, they:

- Managed additional pharmacy duties in lieu of volunteer help
- Filled as many prescriptions as we did during pre-pandemic clinics
- Sourced medical supplies while navigating global shortages and rising shipping costs

BUILDING & GROUNDS UPDATE



In 2020, FOTCOH conducted maintenance to keep our solar panels in good working order. Cleaning and repainting is necessary to avoid sea salt erosion. In the photo above, you can see FOTCOH staff member Angelique helping with the maintenance of solar panel frames. Solar panels are a critical tool that we use regularly to provide power to the clinic.

Additionally, our WASH team conducted the laborious task of constructing a latrine. In the photo below, our crew is transporting heavy blocks through the remote community of Adieu au Monde. With limited roads, there are primarily footpaths to this small community. The blocks were unloaded onto boats to be taken to the construction site near a wooded area by the beach. The latrine is close enough for residents to use safely, but far enough away from their water supply.


