

2021 was our 30th anniversary as an incorporated nonprofit. Year over year, FOTCOH is growing and making a sustainable impact in Haiti. We've kept our doors open every scheduled day, thanks to our dedicated local staff. Our WASH team sprung into action following the earthquake in August 2021, working through the night to distribute water filters to the areas most impacted. Additionally, FOTCOH's new Haitian surgeon and anesthesiologist helped 61 people in 2021.

This past year showed us our model works. It works because we have continually adapted, grown responsibly, and kept our mission close at hand. While we are celebrating 30 years of life-saving transformations, we're also ready to tackle our next challenges and continue being a source of hope and health for people in Haiti!

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

"In Port au Prince right now, going around doing business, you carry your life with you. It's not safe. I'm nervous."

A few years ago, a trip to Port au Prince (PAP) could be completed in a day - or even twice a day. Today, violent gangs stealing from delivery drivers at gunpoint and reduced shipping services in Haiti have turned a 3-hour drive into a 3-day trek for Boyer.

Medications and other crucial supplies that used to arrive directly to our clinic in rural Haiti now have to be picked up from the PAP airport and chartered back to Jacmel (pictured above).

Our Haitian team continues to exercise creative problem solving and persistence in the face of these challenges.



A SUCCESS STORY



Dany Saint Phillippe, 6 months old, Sept '20

At just 2 months old, Baby Dany came to the clinic in severe pain with a birth abnormality (anal perforation with a vaginal fistula).

It was quickly determined that she would need surgery. After a single Facebook post, support from across the U.S. poured in.

Country Director Boyer, Haitian Medical Director Dr. Nelson, U.S. Surgical Director Dr. Lukas, and local Haitian Surgeon Dr. Victor stepped into action. Saving Dany's life required 3 separate surgeries plus treatment for congenital heart failure.

Now, Dany is part of our Medika Mamba nutrition program and thriving! She's steadily gaining weight and has a cheerful personality.

We're honored to have helped baby Dany and give her parents peace of mind, so they can focus on enjoying their family!
