FOTCOH URGENT CARE: MEETING CHALLENGES HEAD-ON

Insights from FOTCOH Director of Operations, Ken Kersey

In the past year, we've witnessed a substantial surge in patient numbers at our Urgent Care Clinics. To enhance our patient management, we've begun integrating cloud-based reporting technology called Backpack EMR, which will greatly improve the precision and efficiency of our patient tracking.

In 2022, we averaged 60 patients per clinic day and our capacity is about 75 patients per day. Boyer and his staff try to clear the line by the end of the day, occasionally seeing upwards of 80 patients.

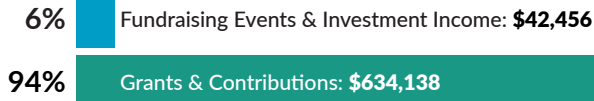


To cope with the escalating demand, Boyer introduced an appointment card system – a strategic move to optimize patient flow. With this system, any patient who isn't treated that day gets a guaranteed slot in the following week's clinic.

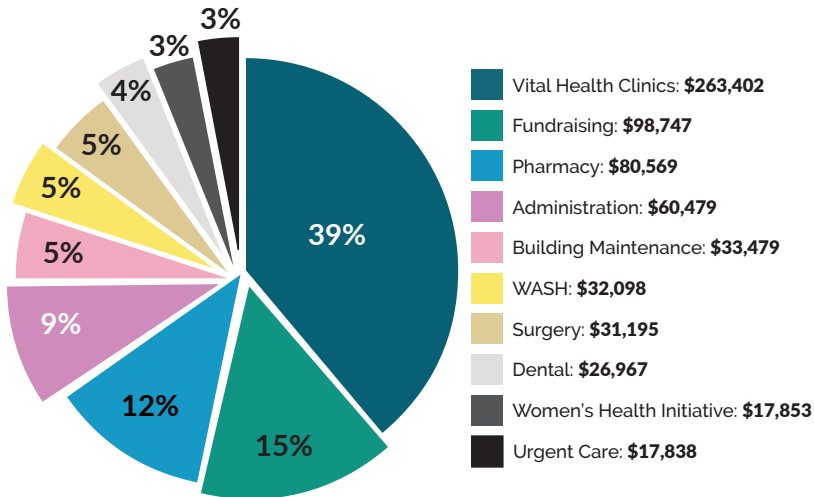
However, when the next clinic begins, there is a huge crowd of people waiting, so some of the patients who return later in the day have to be turned away again. Our staff at FOTCOH is up for the challenge and continues to find innovative solutions. As we press forward, it's clear that our dedication to delivering quality care remains unwavering.

FOTCOH'S WASH WARRIORS: BRINGING CLEAN WATER AND HYGIENE EDUCATION TO RURAL VILLAGES

Clean water, sanitation, and proper hygiene practices are fundamental rights that hold the key to human health and progress. However, Haiti's struggle with access to clean water and sanitation facilities remains a daily challenge.

A staggering 43% of rural Haitians lack clean drinking water, and 80% lack improved sanitation facilities. Haiti still has the lowest coverage rates and access to clean water and sanitation infrastructure in the Americas.

FOTCOH's WASH Program is more than a short-term fix; it's a promise for a healthier, stronger Haiti. By providing families with water filters and education, communities are equipped to break the cycle of waterborne diseases and inadequate sanitation.

The WASH team takes a proactive approach by bringing assistance directly to communities instead of relying solely on clinic visits. This approach not only removes barriers for those who might struggle to travel to clinics but also fosters a sense of community engagement, making the impact of their efforts resonate even stronger.
